The James & Jean Stewart Campus in Belmont Cragin opened its doors in August of 2013 to 254 children and their families. Today, 424 children, from curious infants to self-confident fourth graders, are on track to succeed. Among them is the critical “continuum” cohort: students who entered as infants or very young children and are now transitioning to the elementary school.

Christopher House students are more prepared for kindergarten than their peers in literacy, math, and social/emotional skills.

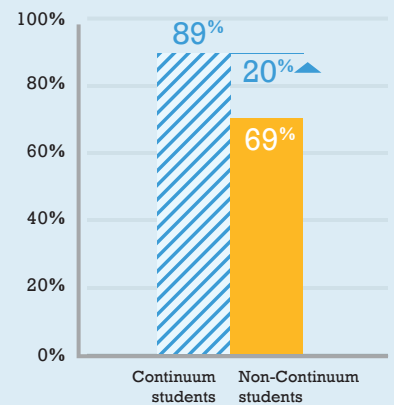
