At Christopher House, we recognize that our programs are only as strong as our staff and teachers, and therefore, we are committed to finding, training, and retaining the most highly-qualified, passionate, and dedicated members of our community to join the Christopher House family.

Coming out of the pandemic, our shared community was, and in many ways still is, experiencing a national teacher shortage in the Early Childhood field. Motivated by our desire to develop accessible career pathways within our community, improve pay equity amongst staff, and close the wealth gap, Christopher House created a unique an innovative solution – the Christopher House Child Development Associate (CDA) Training Program.

What once was a pilot program – in it's infancy only a year ago – is now a successful institution that is rapidly growing to meet the ongoing needs of today's educational landscape. By the end of our pilot year, 100% of participants completed the 12-week training program, receiving 9 transferable college credits upon completion, a 9% increase in overall wages, and practical skills and knowledge that can be directly incorporated into our Early Childhood classrooms.

Our past participants look back on their experience with fondness, pride, and gratitude for the accessible opportunity to further their educational careers, employees like Jorge de la Vega.

First joining the Christopher House team as a paraprofessional working with diverse learning students at our Uptown Campus, Jorge quickly felt right at home. Bringing with him his previous knowledge and experience as an educational psychologist in Spain, Jorge saw Christopher House CDA Pilot Program as an opportunity to expand upon his knowledge of Early Childhood Development and gain a deeper understanding to the United States education system.

"It was a great experience – a challenge and a commitment to my students, my work and myself. Through this experience I was able to connect the theory with my current practice, since the space that the CDA gave us as professionals was incredibly useful, allowing us to share work experiences and knowledge, creating 'science' in the process.

With the first cohort successfully complete, the second cohort is now well underway. As the program continues to grow and expand to offering 3 cohorts annually, as well as piloting an online cohort, Christopher House has invited a community partner, Concordia Place, to share in this vital work.

Food Pantry Program Through New Partnership For over 35 years, Christopher House has provided essential food resources to families in need. However, due to rising food costs and budget constraints following the pandemic, we could no longer financially sustain our on-site food pantries alone. To continue this vital service, we partnered with the Greater

Chicago Food Depository (GCFD) to enhance and expand

our food pantry program.

Christopher House Expands

In October 2024, we re-launched our Stewart campus food pantry with food provided by GCFD, offering our families greater access to nutritious items such as produce, canned and dried goods, milk, eggs, peanut butter, and bread. Our Uptown campus pantry is set to re-launch in March 2025, and our Logan Square campus families now have access to the Stewart pantry.

In addition to food, we rely on our corporate partners and generous supporters to help supply essential household and hygiene items, including paper towels, dish soap, bath tissue, and toothpaste. With your continued support, we can ensure that Christopher House families have access to the resources they need to thrive.

For over 100 years, Christopher House has been serving children and families across Chicago. Known for our highquality, personalized education, Christopher House Infant and Preschool serves over 400 young scholars in Logan Square, Belmont Cragin, and Uptown. With our highly trained staff, unique continuum of education model, Reggio-Emilia inspired curriculum, and proven impact on kindergarten readiness we work to ensure our young scholars have access to all of they resources the need to thrive.









Spreading Holiday Cheer-Family-to-Family Giving Program

For over 35 years, Christopher House has helped bring holiday joy to families through our Family-to-Family (F2F) Holiday Giving Program. Each year, this cherished program supports over 450 families, connecting them with generous donors who fulfill their holiday wish lists. Families share three items they want and three items they need, and donors step in to make the season brighter.

One of our most dedicated supporters has been Kenilworth Union Church (KUC), whose members adopt an estimated 100 families annually. Their generosity has had a profound impact on our families year after year, ensuring children and caregivers alike experience the warmth of the holiday season.

"The holidays are particularly difficult for many of our families financially," said Judith O'Callahan, Manager of Emergency and Community Support Services. "This program helps fulfill some needs and bring joy during this time of year, allowing families to redirect their limited financial resources to other critical areas."

Q. WHAT DO YOU REMEMBER MOST ABOUT YOUR TIME AS A CHRISTOPHER HOUSE SCHOLAR?

Looking back on my time as a Christopher
House scholar, I participated in kindergarten,
the After School and Summer Program, Big
City Mountaineers and the Gear Up College
Prep Program. The thing I remember most is
learning how to interact with peers and teachers
every day. I will never forget the summer job
opportunities I had with Christopher House, which
helped me prepare for the professional world
by being trusted with the responsibility of being
on time each day and working my shift before
heading home.

Q. WHAT IS UNIQUE ABOUT CHRISTOPHER HOUSE?

I think the depth of the relationships formed at Christopher House is truly unique. My relationships with my teachers were great! They taught the curriculum but also brought parts of their own personalities into the classroom that made the learning experience all the more enjoyable – like sharing Michael Jackson videos which fueled my love of music. I still talk to many of them to this day. They have served as teachers, role models, and true mentors in my development.

Q. WHAT DO YOU WISH MORE PEOPLE KNEW ABOUT CHRISTOPHER HOUSE?

I wish more people knew how above and beyond Christopher House goes to help their families, ensuring that they have access to any resources that children and families may need. Personally, my family participated in the holiday program – receiving holiday gifts from generous donors, the food pantry, and the Gear Up program – which provided college scholarships to youth. A memory that has always stuck with me was one year my teacher and her family donated sneakers to me when I had holes in mine. I've always been grateful for their compassion and the memories that I have formed over the years.

Emmanuel may have graduated from Chrisotpher House, but he will forever be a treasured and valued member of our family. He remains involved through personal relationships and volunteer opportunities along with colleagues from Cisco Meraki. Emmanuel, we thank you for continuing to donate your time and heart to our community, ensuring the love and education you experienced will be accessible for thousands more scholars and families for years to come.
