### To our Christopher House Community,

# Across our family of schools, summer has been full of fun and learning.

Our After School had full-day programming and participants explored the city with field trips all over Chicago, including taking a River boat ride and visiting the Lincoln Park Zoo. Our rising kindergarten scholars participated in our Summer Bridge program, a partnership program between our Pre-School and Elementary School to support scholars in their transition to kindergarten. Scholars learn in their new kindergarten classrooms and each scholar receives a "bridge bag" with manipulatives to learn counting and math, art supplies, and reading and writing kits.

As we turn toward fall and the new school year, I am excited to lead such a diverse organization. I know that equity and inclusion is critical to Christopher House's future. It is important that we foster a community of belonging and inclusion that ensures that everyone at Christopher House – from our scholars and families to our staff and partners – is able to do their best work to close the opportunity gap and to thrive.

Christopher House has been intentional about our diversity, belonging, equity, and inclusion (DBEI) journey and I am committed to leading our organization's ongoing, collaborative process that elevates our diverse voices and community members to ensure that Christopher House is a home for all.

## **Creating Equitable Classrooms**

Christopher House's commitment to diversity, belonging, equity and inclusion starts at birth.

Christopher House's Infant & Pre-Schools serves 300 scholars, ages six week to five years old, year-round at our sites in Belmont Cragin, Logan Square, and Uptown. Christopher House delivers on its commitment to diversity, belonging, equity, and inclusion (DBEI) by placing social justice at the center of our work. We believe that every child deserves access to high-quality care and learning that will position them to achieve success in all aspects of life.


Our Early Childhood program meets every scholar and their caregiver where they are, embracing an educational pedagogy that is child-centered, social justice motivated, and Reggio-inspired. Together, we work to create classrooms that incorporate and respect each child's identity as a participating member of the community and continuously facilitate a renewed sense of wonder.

We partner with caregivers to create learning communities where our families' diverse backgrounds and identities are represented and valued in our schools. In fact, 92% of caregivers felt that their family's background and identity were valued at Christopher House and our parents are committed to our DBEI journey. We know that to create a community of belonging we must celebrate our diversity. Year-round our schools distribute books to build each scholar's home library that showcases diverse and inclusive stories and we begin each year with ageappropriate learning units on identity. We nurture a positive sense of identity in order to create confident, self-assured learners, who are aware and respectful of differences around them.

This year, our Early Childhood staff are focused on holistic wellness and socialemotional learning (SEL) to support our DBEI commitment. Meeting students where they are socially and emotionally is critical to ensuring academic success. Christopher House partnered with Fontenelle Art to provide monthly learning communities and discussion sessions during the workday to encourage selfcare and promote specific mindfulness strategies. Each month focused on a different reflective theme while also providing modeling of specific practices such as deep breathing, introductory chair stretches and seated yoga, guided meditation sessions, and art therapy. Outside of work there were optional physical self-care offerings each month like Zumba, Yoga, and

Meditation. Fontenelle Art also offered a virtual parent workshop on mindfulness and self-care.

Together, teachers and caregivers collaborate to foster more inclusive classrooms that will pave the way for our youngest learners to be advocates in creating a brighter, more diverse, inclusive, and equitable future for themselves, their peers, families, and communities.







## Christopher House Voices DONOR SPOTLIGHT: Meet Kartika Sujdak

For over ten years, Kartika Sujdak and her family have supported Christopher House through a number of our programs, but Family-to-Family is probably her and her family's favorite. Family-to-Family is Christopher House's holiday program that matches community members with Christopher House scholars and families to ensure that everyone in our community receives some holiday joy – from a holiday meal to gifts. Kartika's impact knows no bounds and her energetic "yes!" makes her such a wonderful partner.

Christopher House reached out and asked Kartika some questions about her volunteering and we are thrilled to share her "Christopher House Story" with you.

### How did you find Christopher House?

Google! I was on my child's school's Parent Teacher Organization, and we had extra school supplies from a Back-to-School event we hosted and I wanted to make sure that nothing went to waste, and saw this as an opportunity to pay-it-forward. It was only as a parent that I realized how expensive completing school supply lists could be – from pencil, binders, notebooks. So, I started getting in the habit of collecting these items year-round and especially when they went on sale. This practice morphed into buying all the supplies I could get my hands on each year, and dropping off the extras at Christopher House for their scholars.

I also started to reach out to my network – family, school friends, and even my company – to ask if they had school and office supplies they could pay-forward. Word spread, and I now have people and companies reaching out to me to donate their unused or extra items, which I still go and pick up, sort in my basement, and my first call is always Christopher House.

### What are some of the programs you participate in?

From school supplies, an obvious, natural progression for me and my family was participating in the Family-to-Family program. I was born and raised in a Hindu family in India. We moved to the US when I as in high school, and I always found the holiday season fascinating! It's hard not to get enthralled with the spirit of the holiday, especially in Chicago with the snow, festive music, and decorations. The

Christopher House's two-generation model ensures that we provide scholars with high-quality, personalized education with family immersive supports, starting at birth. Our Parent School supports every caregiver at Christopher House in building a stable and healthy home environment so that families can thrive. Key supports include our Family Advocates, individual and group counseling, on-site food pantries, parent education workshops, and emergency financial assistance. Advocates, who build strong, trusting relationships with our caregivers. Said best by our *Director of Family & Community Engagement, Juan Villalobos, "our work starts with a conversation. The ability to build a strong relationship with parents and caregivers, helps them in turn, come to us, engage, be really open and honestly and ask for what they need."* 

Our Family Advocates are full-time Christopher House staff, who work to break down barriers and remove the stigma surrounding asking for support. They act as connectors between caregivers, scholars, teachers, staff, and other

### **INFANT & PRESCHOOL**

prepares 300+ children, ages six weeks to five years, for kindergarten through full-day education that stimulates cognitive growth and develops emotional intelligence.

We are thrilled to share that each of our sites are accredited by the National Association of Education of Young Children (NAEYC) – a distinction awarded to only 10% of schools across the country – and our Uptown site received its re-accreditation this Spring with an 92% overall rating!



### AFTER SCHOOL

works with 200+ scholars, ages six – eighteen, to explore new opportunities, achieve academic excellence, and develop healthy behaviors and skills needed to be successful in school, home, college, and the workplace.

Our scholars enjoyed full-day programming during the summer that included STEAM focused activities and field trips throughout Chicago! Uptown Youth Leadership students participated in the Graceland Wall Project as part of Uptown Art Week. Together, scholars collaboratively designed and painted a 4x4 canvas along with other local artists.

### **ELEMENTARY & MIDDLE SCHOOL** provides over 480 scholars K-8th grade with a personalized education in a college-going culture.

92% of our second graduating class of JoAnne L. Cicchelli Middle School students were accepted to their top five best fit high school – and many are attending CPS Selective Enrollment High Schools, including Lane Tech, Jones College Prep, Whitney Young, and Northside Prep.



### PARENT SCHOOL

engages every parent of each school in order to create a stable, healthy home environment that advances their child's academic and social-emotional development.

In addition to bi-weekly food pantries and community events like mobile Dental bus, the Parent School had two interns this summer through our partnership with Origami Works Foundation. The interns summer project was a community resource assessment and mapping project.



## The Class of 2022 Christopher House Graduates its Second 8th Grade Class

On June 10, Christopher House graduated its second 8th grade class. The Class of 2022 includes many students who have attended our continuum of education model since kindergarten.

Among the graduating class, we are pleased to share that for the second year in a row three students were awarded the Daniel Murphy Scholarship, a prestigious scholarship awarded to only 150 Chicago students to attend college preparatory schools. Nine students are attending CPS Selective Enrollment High Schools, including Lane Tech College Preparatory High School, Whitney M. Young Magnet High School, Jones College Prep, Walter Payton College Preparatory High School, and Northside College Preparatory High School. This is a 25% increase from the year before and 92% of students are attending their top five best-fit high school.

Christopher House has been a profound place in our scholars' lives – a second home and a place where they grew up. Many students learned English at Christopher House, it's where students recognize they developed their sense of self and character. For Jason, who attended Christopher House since Pre-School at our Logan Square campus, Christopher House is *"like a second family. I've gone here my whole life."* Melanie, who will be attending Prosser High School, reflected, *"Christopher House means a lot to me because I've been here since Kindergarten, and I grew up here. It also means a lot because this is where I met my friends."* 

This eighth grade class is success bound! Christopher House is humbled by our scholars' achievements and grateful to all the caregivers, who have partnered with us to build a supportive, collaborative, community to nurture and educate these future leaders. We can't wait to see what the Class of 2022 achieves in high school and beyond.
